

MEETING THE NEEDS OF ALL STUDENTS IN OUR DISTRICT

When a Community Comes Together: OW's 2021-22 Year in Review

In 2021-22, OW used the funds raised from the yard sales and community donations to provide financial support to our 16 projects, with budgeted expenses of \$65,000. In addition to supporting our projects, this past year, OW:

- Provided \$10,000 for the purchase of two therapy dogs (Andre at MASH and Cosmos at
- Shepherdstown)
- Provided \$5,000 to MASD Building Funds for schools to use at their discretion to assist
- students.
- Provided \$4,000 in a college scholarship (\$1000/year for 4 years) to a graduating MASD senior.
- This was our 6th scholarship awarded.
- Provided \$10,000 to the District for the 2022 Summer Food Program
- Purchased \$1,125 in grocery store gift cards to be distributed to families in need within the
- district.
- Provided \$4,000 to the Mechanicsburg Recreation Board to fund scholarships for after school
- programs.
- Provided \$8,000 to the Mechanicsburg Recreation Board to fund the Recreation Scholarship
- Funds.
- Provided \$4,000 to the MASD food pantries to fund the purchase of food items.
- Provided \$5,000 to district for student support (to assist in purchase of hygiene kits)
- Provided \$2,500 to Mechanicsburg Music Alliance (MMA) to provide scholarships for MMA
- students

In addition to financial support, in 2021-22, OW provided the following items to students and families thanks to the generous donations of the community:

- 90 backpacks provided to students before start of school
- 65 bikes and numerous helmets given out to kids and families.
- Dozens of books donated to students, dozens of book donated to teacher classrooms, 65
- children received books through Project Legacy
- Numerous clothing requests fulfilled for students and families
- 208 coats provided to students during Thanksgiving and Gift Box distributions
- 150 families able to cleats for their soccer and baseball players
- 19 families received 43 Mattresses/boxsprings/bed frames, 31 dressers, 9 table and chair
- sets, 13 sets of living room furniture, 58 bed pillows, plus many other families who came out
- to the warehouse for lamps, bedding, towels, rugs, dishes, pots and pans, vacuums, small
- electrics and more
- 321 holiday gifts donated to district students
- 17 district families adopted through Project Legacy
- 2,028 of socks, underwear, bras and tee-shirts donated through school drives
- 21 families received holiday trees and decorations
- 140 Thanksgiving baskets provided to district families
